( 125 ) St. JOHN.



THIS is the Disciple that Jesus loved. He was the Fungest of all the Apostles, and survived the longest, being an hundred years old, when he died. He was the most firm and stedfast of all the Disciples, in the attachment to his master, not being assumed to own him when surrounded by guards: he followed him to the cross, and before he was crucified, as a proof of the tender affection he entertained for his beloved Disciple, he recommended his mother to the procession of John a duty he suffiled by taking her to his own house, and behaving to her with the most pious silla attention till her death.

St. John propagated the gospel in Asia, and resided some time at Ephesus; he also sounded churches at Sidyrna, Pergamos, Tliyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia, Lacodicea, and other places. He was at length condemned at Rome, to be thrown into a chaldron orboiling oil, but he came out unhurt, he was afterwards tanished to Patmos, where he wrote the Revelations, and died.
