St THOMAS was a Jew, by trade a fisherman. He was a zealous and affectionate disciple of his blessed. Master, but flow of beld f. He preached to the Massi, or learned men of Persi, travelled through Æthiop a and in India, and preached there to the Brachmans, infrusting them in the principles of charlitanity, and prevailed with many to renounce their superstitions, and embrace the faith of Christ: A church is extant there to this day. He buils a church at Maliapur, where also he wrought several miracles, by which he converted the prince and many of the people.

St. Thomas yied frequently to retire to a tomb near Maliapur, where he was at last followed by forme jealous Brachmans, who found him at prayer; they there dispatched him with darts and stones, and running a lance through his body. He was buried in the church

of his own founding.
