St. BARNABAS, though not one of the twelve, is yet honored with the title of apostle by St. Luke. He was of the tribe of Levi, of a family out of Judea, settled in the isse of Cyprus, where they had an estate.—He was educated at Jerusalem with St. Paul, by the learned Gamaliel.

When St. Paul came to Jerusalem, after his converfion, he found Barnabas there, who introduced him to the rest of the apostles, and abode in Peter's house sifteen days. He afterwards travelled with St. Paul, and preached to the Gentiles with great success.

It is faid that Barnabas ended his days in his own country, Cyprus, where certain Jews, enraged at his fuccess in preaching, set upon him in the fynagogue, where they that him up till night, when they brought him forth, and after torturing him, they stoned him to death.
